My plea to you is remember 'more hands, less work'. A key focus for the district this year was the Squash in Schools initiative that was partially funded by Kiwi Sport. In 2014, Squash Wellington has secured some funding for squash in schools which will be used to assist those clubs that wish to introduce it into their clubs. Coachforce was also a key focus for the district and one that created most of the challenges. Willie Bicknell continued on ensuring modules were being delivered. Delivering coach force ensures that the District is gaining a pool of coaches.
