

## Masters Update

Late last year a call went out from SW to bring together a Masters Representative group to explore opportunities to grow our Masters offerings in Wellington as well as review the Masters Representative team selection criteria, aiming to;

- provide more competition for our master's population – to encourage participation.
- ensure a consistent, fair and transparent criteria and process was put in place to ensure all eligible players had an opportunity to participate in inter-district events.

A group was formed – thanks all! - which worked quickly and thoroughly to generate and evaluate various options. It put up a report to the Squash Wellington Board with the following recommendations:

### **SW Masters Working Group**

*Form a volunteer group to drive our masters' participation programme, act as the conduit between the Masters population and SW and share club feedback on master's issues with the SW Board.*

A working group of volunteers was endorsed by the Board in its January 2021 Board meeting as follows:

- Bryan Smith – Chair / SW Masters Convenor
- Louise Sinclair – Secretary
- Darin Galliers – Working Group Member

These members are often spotted at tournaments so don't be shy in introducing yourself and having a yarn.

### **Masters Club Representative**

*Each club should provide a rep on Masters issues to be a contact for the District Manager on day-to-day issues*

A call has gone out via email from the District Manager to all clubs. We're still looking for more people so if you are interested, please contact your Club Captain/Manager.

From this group, additional SW Masters Working Group members will be sought, so if you're interested in joining that Group, please put your hand up to be your club representative.

## **Masters Interclub – New format**

*Re-format Masters Interclub to make it more attractive.*

Late last year SW had over 50 Masters from across Wellington trial a new interclub format and it was a huge success! We'll now incorporate this format into the 2021 Interclub.

Masters Interclub has traditionally been held on a Wednesday with dwindling participation numbers in recent years. This year we'll hold Masters on a Monday night in response to customer feedback! The rules are the same as normal Interclub with the following exceptions:

- Teams will be of mixed gender (i.e., male and Female) - where possible.
- B&C grades MAY be merged depending on numbers.
- There will be NO supper except for the final round to which every player will make a small cash contribution.
- Subs cannot be more than 200 points higher than the player he/she is replacing.
- Each grade is played together in the same club every week, with a different club each week (where possible, some clubs may host more than 1 round)

Wrapping up the Masters update we have a couple more participation initiatives that will be launched soon, one being a Masters of Masters series so watch this space!


